## Check figures asap

Robert Crisp attended the Leet Court in the years 1695,98 and 99. There is an inventory in my inventory list too O.W. 3/29 where he is described as a warrener.

Thomas Burges is mentioned only once in the Leet Court records – in 1691 but he was later mayor several times as a Howard representative. First in 1705, then in 1713, 1715, 1717, 1719, 1721, 1725, 1727, 1729 and 1731. He died in office and was succeeded by Richard Mortlock.

Henry Bowes is not mentioned
